## **Topics Required by Section 1003.42(2), F.S.**

Each of the following required instructional topics will be taught through core content areas or standalone lessons aligned with Florida state standards and reinforced through interdisciplinary connections:

- **Declaration of Independence & U.S. Constitution**: Grades K–12 through Wonders (K–5), McGraw-Hill U.S. Government & Civics (6–12), and AP courses.
- Federalist Papers & Republican Government: Grades 7–12 through Civics360 and U.S. Government curriculum.
- History of the Holocaust: Grades K–12 through integrated lessons using Wonders (K–5), Savvas (5–8), McGraw-Hill/AP World History.
- **History of African Americans**: Embedded in Wonders (K–5), McGraw-Hill U.S. History (6–12), and AP U.S. History.
- **History of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders**: Integrated throughout K–12 social studies curriculum using McGraw-Hill and supplemental resources.
- Florida History & Civics: Focused in upper elementary social studies and reinforced in Grade 7 Civics using Civics360 (Florida Transformative Education / Lou Frey Institute).
- Effects of Substances on the Body: Delivered through health/PE courses using *The Facts. Your Future*. initiative, SPARK PE, and Red Ribbon Week activities.
- **Civic & Character Education**: Delivered through ELA and social studies classes using Satchel Pulse, and Civics Literacy Excellence Initiative (CLEI) K–12 curriculum, and Civics360 (Florida Transformative Education / Lou Frey Institute).
- Veterans & Medal of Honor Instruction: Embedded in Veterans Day lessons and social studies content via McGraw-Hill and teacher-led enrichment.
- **Kindness to Animals**: Delivered through special programs using Animal Rights Foundation of Florida (ARFF) humane education presentations tailored for K–12 classrooms.
- Natural Resource Conservation: Delivered through science courses using Savvas Experience Science (Grades 5–8).
- Free Enterprise Principles: Covered in elementary grades using Florida Joint Center for Citizenship (FJCC) and further emphasized in high school through EverFi and Ramsey Solutions (9–12).
- Women's & Hispanic Contributions: highlighted schoolwide through integrated classroom lessons and school-wide activities during Women's History Month (March) and Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15–October 15) using resources from the Florida Department of Education Women's History and Hispanic Heritage Month Portal.
- Agricultural Education: Offered through middle and high school agritechnology courses using Cengage Agriscience and Aquaculture materials.

- ACCESS Students (K–12): Receive instruction using Unique Learning System and ESE-adapted materials.
- ELLs (K-12): Supported with Lexia English, Wonders ELD, and scaffolds embedded in SAVVAS and i-Ready.
