What is a Community Partnership School (CPS)?

The CPS model:

- Involves forming long-term relationships between core partners, including a school district, a university or college, a community-based nonprofit, and healthcare providers
- Aims to provide a comprehensive set of supports and opportunities to promote whole child, family, and community well-being
- Intends to benefit community members, parents, and students through collaborative efforts with partners who have a shared vision to provide an array of health and education services
